The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Kalbar Showground's. Exhibitors should check electrical equipment and leads before coming to the Showground's to avoid the occurrence of any difficulties.

1. All competitors must pay admission fees.
2. All entries close at 9:30am on judging day.
3. Judging to commence at 9:30am on Friday, June 18th, 2010.
4. **Exhibitor Points Calculation:**
 - Any First Place - 3 points,
 - Any Second Place - 2 points
 - Any Third Place - 1 point.
 - Any Champion – 3 points.
 - Any Reserve Champion – 2 points
5. All exhibits in this section must be delivered no later than 9:30am on Friday, June 18th 2010.
6. Prize Money may be picked up after 3:00pm on Saturday, June 19th 2010.
7. The Society will not accept any liability for produce exhibited, the risk being that of the exhibitor.
8. Electrical Equipment- Any exhibitors intending to bring electrical equipment and or gas bottles to the showground's will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor or gas fitter.
