The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Kalbar Showground's. Exhibitors should check electrical equipment and leads before coming to the Showground's to avoid the occurrence of any difficulties.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All competitors must pay Gate admission fees.
2. All exhibits to be in the hands of the Secretary by 12 noon, Wednesday, June 16th 2010.
3. All exhibits must have been completed in the last 12 months. Work recognized as being over 1 year old will be classed as non-competitive.
4. All exhibits must have included, the exhibits name and class number of which they are entered.
5. Judging to commence at 9:00am on Friday, June 18th, 2010.
6. **Exhibitor Points Calculation:**
 - Any First Place - 3 points,
 - Any Second Place - 2 points
 - Any Third Place - 1 point.
 - Any Champion – 3 points.
 - Any Reserve Champion – 2 points
7. Prize Money may be picked up after 4:00pm on Saturday, June 19th 2010.
8. The Society will provide greatest care but will not accept any liability for items exhibited, the risk being that of the exhibitor.
9. Electrical Equipment- Any exhibitors intending to bring electrical equipment and or gas bottles to the showground's will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor or gas fitter. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and general public and is a requirement of work place health and safety act of 1995. The act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed on the Kalbar showground's. Exhibitors should check all electrical equipment and all gas bottles to avoid occurrences of any difficulties

1. Fine Yarn, Skein of 20 metres Washed, Plied, Suitable for Baby Wear or Lightweight.
2. Medium Yarn, Skein of 20 metres Washed, Plied, Suitable for Outer Garments.
3. Strong Yarn, Skein of 20 metres Washed, Plied or Single, Suitable for Floor Rugs, Wall Hangings etc.
4. Hand Woven Article, Any Medium and Technique – **First Prize \$5.00, Donated**
5. Lightweight Article Made from Hand Spun Yarn, Fewer than 100g (Shawls, Baby Wear).
6. Garment Made from Hand Spun Yarn
7. Garment Made from Pigmented Yarn.
8. Natural Dyed Yarns. A Selection of Naturally Dyed Hand Spun Yarns, Displayed to their BEST Advantage, Accompanied by Particulars of Materials AND Methods.
9. NOVICE CLASS – Any Article Made from Hand Spun Yarn by a Novice.
10. Article or Garment Felted
